Funding Changes

Goal#2 Any additional funds will provide our virtual students with in-person, hands-on learning activities or field trips, including costs for guest speakers, buses, entry fees, and new technologies that engage our students (Gimkit, Class Edu). Goal#2 Additional funds will also help teachers attend conferences that directly increase their ability to teach virtually (UCET) and cover professional development opportunities to help increase engagement for virtual students. This may be in the form of conference registration fees, subs, books for pd, digital access to PD courses, or recordings.
